Iris Vandeligt, R.N., B.ScN., CPMHN

Dr. Marr is a Psychiatrist and Medical Program Manager at Northeast Mental Health Centre's Regional Children's Psychiatric Centre in Sudbury, Ontario. His early training was in Dumfries and Glasgow, Scotland, followed by residency at the University of Saskatchewan. He has dual training in General and Child and Adolescent Psychiatry.
